### ONE TO WATCH

SR FS **Matthew Harper** had a career game in the Big House against Michigan, posting nine tackles, one sack and one interception, which he ran back 55 yards to set up Oregon's first points of the game (FG). He made at least two potential touchdown-saving plays - one on a pass breakup and one on a diving ankle tackle of U-M Heisman Trophy candidate Mike Hart.

### GAME TIME

Saturday's kickoff between Oregon and Fresno State at Autzen Stadium is set for 4 p.m. PDT. The game had been scheduled for 3:30 p.m. but was moved back to accommodate the Oregon Sports Network telecast.

### THE SERIES

The Ducks and Bulldogs are meeting for a third consecutive season and eighth time overall. UO has won five straight in the series, dating back to 1996, and lead 5-2 all-time. Last season, Oregon won in Fresno, 31-24.

### QUICK HITS

- **Mike Bellotti** is one victory away from his 100th as head coach at Oregon.
- Oregon has now been ranked in at least one of the two major polls at some point of all 13 seasons under **Mike Bellotti**.
- SR QB **Dennis Dixon** is fifth in the nation in pass efficiency rating (193.21).
- Through the first two weeks of the season, Oregon ranks third nationally in turnover margin (3.5). Last year, the Ducks finished 109th (-0.77).
- Oregon has now been ranked in at least one of the two major polls at some point of all 13 seasons under **Mike Bellotti**.
- The Ducks are off to a 2-0 start for the third straight year and 11th time in their last 15 seasons.
- A week after scoring the most points of any Pac-10 team (48), Oregon allowed the fewest points (7) of any conference member in Week 2.
- Five of the Ducks 11 touchdowns have come from outside the Red Zone. Oregon has scored six TDs while in the Red Zone, but ranks second from the bottom in overall RZ efficiency at 70.0 percent.

**VOTE FOR DENNIS ...** SR QB **Dennis Dixon** is one of four candidates for the AT&T All-America Player of the Week Award. Fans can determine the winner by sending the text message "VOTE" to 8-7-6-5-4 from a wireless phone. Fans have until 11:59 p.m. ET on Wednesday to submit their votes.

**VOTE FOR OREGON ...** The University of Oregon has been nominated as one of four finalists for the "Pontiac Game Changing Performance" for the second week of the 2007 NCAA Football Season. Now it's up to Oregon fans to determine if the Ducks earn the title. UO fans can go to [www.pontiac.com/ncaa](http://www.pontiac.com/ncaa), where they can view video clips of the four finalists and vote for their favorite play. Voting ends at midnight on Wednesday. ESPN will announce this week's "Pontiac Game Changing Performance" winner, on Thursday night, during the Pontiac Performance Halftime Report. The winning university earns a \$5,000 contribution from Pontiac to their general scholarship fund. Additionally, the winning play will be nominated for the "Pontiac Game Changing Performance of the Year" and the chance to win a \$100,000 General Scholarship from Pontiac.

**MEDIA AVAILABILITY ...** **Mike Bellotti** will be available to all media via a weekly teleconference every Tuesday beginning at 11 a.m. (PDT). Participants may take part in the media availability in person at the Casanova Center or on the phone. To gather more information on the availability or notify the Office of Media Services of your intent to take part, please call (541) 346-5488.

**NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS ...** The Ducks have amassed a 26-1 record in non-conference games in Autzen Stadium during **Mike Bellotti's** head coaching tenure. Their lone home loss during that span was dealt by Indiana (30-24) to open the 2004 season. Overall, Oregon has accumulated a 36-5 non-league slate in Bellotti's previous 12 years at the helm.

**NEARING THE CENTURY MARK ...** Oregon's **Mike Bellotti** is one victory away from joining a select number of coaches who have accumulated 100 or more wins at one school

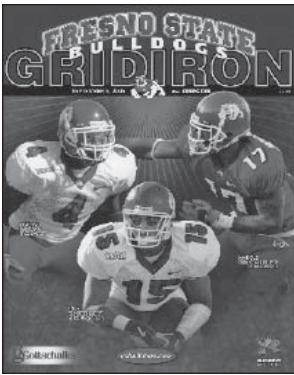
in the Pac-8/Pac-10 Conference. Leading the way is Washington's **Don James**, who tallied a 153-57-2 mark (1975-92) in 18 seasons in Seattle. The other four were UCLA's **Terry Donahue** (151-74-8; 1976-95), as well as USC's **John McKay** (127-40-8; 1960-75), **Howard Jones** (121-36-13; 1925-40) and **John Robinson** (104-35-4; 1976-82, 1993-97). **Tommy Prothro** did combine for a 104-55-5 record at Oregon State (1955-64) and UCLA (1965-70), but 63 wins were the most posted at one school (OSU). **Frank Kush** acquired a 176-54-1 ledger in 22 seasons at Arizona State but only 12 of those wins occurred after the Sun Devils became a part of the Pac-10 in 1978.

**THE WEBFOOT NINE ...** A first in **Mike Bellotti's** Oregon career, the Ducks have had nine true freshman make appearances in 2007. DT **Tonio Celotto**, WR **Drew Davis**, CB **Talmadge Jackson III**, HB **Malachi Lewis**, FS **Jeffrey Maehl**, LB **Casey Matthews**, PK **Daniel Padilla** and DE **Kenny Rowe** all saw action in the season opener Sept. 1 vs. Houston, while CB **Anthony Gildon** joined the frosh parade at Michigan Sept. 8. Bellotti had never used more than seven true freshmen in any single season since taking over head coaching duties in 1995. A total of 11 newcomers were identified by Bellotti during the preseason as possibilities to take the field as first-year freshmen before the year is over. Three true freshmen played for the Ducks last season (QB **Nate Costa**, RB **Andre Crenshaw** and WR **Derrick Jones**), with the most first-year collegians to play in Bellotti's first 12 seasons being seven (2004).

**TOTAL 'O' ...** SR QB **Dennis Dixon** cruised into Oregon's career record book for total offense, thanks to his 368-yard effort at Michigan, Sept. 8. Dixon ranks 10th all-time with 4,289 yards.

**ON THE RUN ...** When most people think of the spread offense, they perceive it to be a means to throw the football more. While the pass remains a staple of the Oregon offense, the spread also has evolved as a way to run the football more efficiently in the three seasons since **Mike Bellotti** has implemented the system. A year ago, the Ducks managed to lead the Pacific-

Place-kicker Paul Martinez scored on a 4-yard run on a fake field goal with 4:55 left and rover Patrick Chung ended all doubt with an interception with 10 seconds remaining in the game as No. 20

Oregon avoided becoming Fresno State's latest upset victim by way of big special teams plays.

With the score tied at 24-24 late in the fourth quarter, the Bulldogs appeared to stop the Ducks on third-and-goal inside the 5-yard line. Holder Brady Leaf took the snap for the apparent field goal try and ran to his left, drawing two defenders before pitching the ball to Martinez on an option play as Martinez stumbled in for the tie-breaking score.

Oregon's previous touchdown also was set up by a key play from field goal range. The Bulldogs appeared to seize the momentum when Bear Pascoe blocked Martinez's 36-yard field goal attempt in the third quarter before a Fresno State player tried to recover the football. The ball squirted loose and Matt Toeaina recovered at the 5 for the Ducks. Jeremiah Johnson ran it into the end zone on the next play to give Oregon a 24-17 edge.

Fresno State answered with a 74-yard drive to open the fourth quarter, resulting in a 1-yard score that knotted the score with 10:57 remaining.

Johnson ran for 74 yards and two touchdowns and set up two scores with long punt returns as he starred in place of injured starter Jonathan Stewart, who sprained his ankle against Stanford.

Jaison Williams caught six passes for 106 yards for his first career 100-yard receiving effort.

Fresno State got the sellout crowd into a frenzy after just the first play from scrimmage when Ahijah Lane stripped the ball from receiver Jordan Kent and Dwayne Andrews recovered at the Oregon 45. That set up a 32-yard field goal from Clint Stitser that gave the Bulldogs a 3-0 lead.

Following a Stewart touchdown, Johnson's 20-yard punt return set up his own 5-yard TD run late in the first quarter to make it 14-3, and his 27-yard punt return set up a 38-yard field goal by Martinez with 38 second left in the half to make it 17-10.

**ABOUT THE BULLDOGS**

Fresno State comes to Autzen Stadium on the heels of a heart-breaking loss, 47-45 in three overtimes, at the hands of No. 23 Texas A&M in College Station.

The Bulldogs (1-1), who went 4-8 last year and opened 2007 against FCS squad (formerly 1-AA) Sacramento State, came back from a 19-0 halftime deficit against the Big 12 Aggies, eventually tying the score at 29-all on a 3-yard TD pass from JR QB **Tom Brandstater** to JR

TE **Bear Pascoe** with 0:05 seconds remaining.

After the teams traded equal scores in the first two extra periods, A&M went ahead 47-39 in the third on a short TD run and two-point conversion. Brandstater and Pascoe hooked up again on the Bulldogs' ensuing possession for a

9-yard score, but their two-point attempt failed.

On the season, Brandstater has completed 37-of-59 passes for 459 yards. He has four TDs and just one interception.

Fresno State's ground game is led by FR RB **Ryan Mathews**, who has 143 yards and averages 6.5 yards per carry. Pascoe is Brandstater's main target, catching 10 balls for 161 yards and all four of his passing TDs.

A pair of linebackers, SR **Marcus Riley** (13 TT/gm) and redshirt FR **Ben Jacobs** (11.5 TT/gm) pace the defense with an average of 13 tackles per game.

As evidenced by their second-half comeback against the Aggies, the Bulldogs are representative of a **Pat Hill** coached team and should never be taken lightly. Hill, who has a 77-52 career mark in 11 seasons in Fresno, always seems to get the most out of his players.

**OREGON VS. FRESNO STATE THUMBNAILS**

- All five of Oregon's wins against Fresno State have been by seven points or less, and the last three meetings at Autzen have been decided by four points or less.
- The Bulldogs' two wins in the series were both tight as well; 23-16 in 1981, and 10-4 in 1982.
- Not counting OT, Fresno State has outscored its two opponents by a 39-10 margin in the second half.
- Fresno State has thrown just one interception in two games, but has turned the ball over via a fumble on five occasions.
- Of Oregon's 11 penalties this year, eight have resulted in an opponent 1st Down and one negated a rushing TD by **Jonathan Stewart**, ultimately forcing the Ducks to kick a field goal.
- Both Oregon and Fresno State will use the same starters from their 2006 meeting at quarterback in SR **Dennis Dixon** and JR **Tom Brandstater**, respectively.
- JR RB **Jonathan Stewart** played one down in last year's match-up, scoring on a 3-yard run.
- The Ducks held JR TE **Bear Pascoe** to 10 yards on one catch in 2006.
- Fresno State was picked No. 3 by the coaches and No. 4 by the media in the WAC preseason polls. Hawaii and Boise State were the consensus 1-2 in both polls.

10 Conference in rushing (182.2 avg.) for the first time since 1955. After two games, Oregon not only finds itself atop the league in rushing (335.0 avg.), it ranks third in the country (behind Arkansas, 350.0 avg.; and West Virginia, 339.0 avg.). While the Ducks have accumulated more rushing yards than passing in each of their first two games, it marks the first time the statistics have weighed in favor of the running game on consecutive occasions since the 2000 season. They ran for 208 yards and passed for 153 against UCLA before running for 229 and passing for 119 vs. Washington.

**TURKEY DAY ... SR QB Dennis Dixon** threw three strikes that resulted in touchdowns at Michigan, Sept. 8, matching a career high equaled twice before. His four TDs overall (1 rush) established a personal best for total touchdowns in a game.

**DIXON IS PLAYER OF THE WEEK ... SR QB Dennis Dixon** was named the Pac-10 Offensive Player of the Week for Week 2 after guiding the Ducks to a 39-7 victory over Michigan. Dixon three 3 TDs, rushed for another and totaled 368 yards of offense. Dixon was also the *Rivals.com* Pac-10 POTW. In addition, Dixon has been nominated for the *USA Today* Player of the Week and AT&T All-America POTW award, which is determined by fan voting via text messaging and will be announced at halftime of ESPN's game between West Virginia and Maryland.

**DEAN OF THE PAC-10 ...** Not only does 13th-year head coach **Mike Bellotti** resume his role as the longest-tenured football mentor in the conference, he stands as one of its most successful. Surpassed only by USC in overall wins in the Pacific-10 Conference during his Oregon tenure (99-48), he is among an elite collection of all-time conference coaches who have won 60 or more league games during their illustrious careers in the loop currently known as the Pac-10. Only nine conference brethren have ever achieved that milestone as Bellotti is tied for eighth on the Pac-10's all-time list of league coaching victories (60-37) with former Arizona coach Dick Tomey. That record places him 17th on the league's career winning percentage list in Pac-10 games (.619).

**CLIMBING THE LADDER ... Mike Bellotti** became the winningest football coach in the history of the University of Oregon in 2006, surpassing the 91 victories secured by **Rich Brooks** (1977-94). Only **Hugo Bezdek** (72.7%—1906, 1913-17) has accumulated a better winning percentage than Bellotti's 67.3 percent (99-48) among his peers who have coached the Ducks a minimum of three seasons.

**STAFF CHANGES ... Chip Kelly** is in his first year as the program's sixth offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach under

head coach Mike Bellotti. Kelly spent the past eight seasons as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at New Hampshire, with the Wildcats finishing second in the NCAA's Championship Subdivision (I-AA) in total offense (493.5), third in scoring (41.7) and fifth in passing (300.1 avg.) in 2005. He replaces **Gary Crowton**, who departed to assume the same role at LSU. In addition, former Oregon special teams coordinator/tight ends coach (1995-2000) **Tom Osborne** returns to Eugene in his same capacity after spending the past six years at Arizona State.

**CONTINUITY ...** Of the Ducks' 10 coaches, five of them have coached at Oregon for a minimum of 15 years.

**FOLLOW THE LIGHTNING YELLOWBRICK ROAD ...** It certainly didn't take long for the return of special teams coordinator **Tom Osborne** to make an impact following a six-year hiatus. Osborne, who served in the identical capacity as the Ducks' special teams coordinator/tight ends coach from 1995-2000 before spending the past six years at Arizona State, returned to Eugene prior to this season and so far has paid immediate dividends. After the first two weeks of the season, Oregon finds itself ranked second in the Pacific-10 Conference in kickoff returns (15th nationally, 27.6 avg.); and fifth in punt returns (10.86 avg.) and net punting (36.43 avg.). In addition, JR RB **Jonathan Stewart** is second in kickoff returns (28.25 avg.). A year ago, the Ducks finished 10th in net punting (33.3 avg.).

**GAME DAY HONOREES ...** During the Ducks' home game versus Fresno State, Oregon will be honoring the **1957 team** that played in the Rose Bowl during a halftime presentation. In addition, former All-America **Ahmad Rashad** (Bobby Moore) will be recognized in a pregame ceremony for his recent selection to the College Football Hall of Fame. Rashad will become the seventh Duck enshrined in the Hall later this year.

**THE STREAK GOES ON ... JR C Max Unger** and JR ROV **Patrick Chung** extended their respective starting streaks to 27 games at Michigan on Sept. 8. The duo has started every game played by the Ducks since the beginning of 2005. Unger's two starts this season have been at center after moving over from tackle.

**BORN TO BE A DUCK ... FR H-Back Malachi Lewis** may have grown up in California, but his first few days on earth were spent in Eugene, where his mother Sheila (Sattiewhite) Lewis spent four-years as a letterwinner on the Ducks' women's basketball team. Born at Sacred Heart Hospital, the younger Lewis played his first college football game less than two miles away at Autzen Stadium on Sept. 1 and recovered a blocked punt to set up a key third-quarter

touchdown in UO's win over Houston.

**BOWL PREDICTIONS** ... Website CBS SportsLine publishes Bowl predictions on a weekly basis, following the results of each week's games. In the first three weeks of their prognostications, Oregon has changed potential Bowl sites and opponents three times. Before the opener, the Ducks were slated to face Wyoming in the **Armed Forces Bowl**. After beating Houston, UO moved up to the **Emerald Bowl** vs. Boise State, and after last Saturday's win at Michigan, the Ducks are pegged for a **Sun Bowl** showdown with Rutgers.

**BUSTIN' LOOSE** ... SR QB **Dennis Dixon's** 50-yard run in the first quarter of the Sept. 1 game vs. Houston was the longest rush of his career until an 80-yard TD scamper in the 3rd. The 80-yard carry was the longest by a UO player since **Ricky Whittle** had an 80-yarder of his own vs. Cal on Nov. 7, 1992.

**RUNNING IT UP** ... The Ducks have surpassed the 300-yard rushing mark in both games this season, totaling 339 vs. Houston and 331 at Michigan. Oregon has four games of 300-plus since the start of 2006 and the game against the Cougars marked the highest total since setting the school record of 446 yards at Washington State Oct. 27, 2001.

**MIRACLE MAN** ... SR FS **Ryan DePalo** completed his miraculous comeback from a torn ACL is his left knee, making a first-quarter tackle in the season opener, 18 weeks removed from surgery. When he suffered the injury during spring drills it appeared his return would be delayed until the Bowl season.

**TURNOVER TURNAROUND** ... **Mike Bellotti** has long professed that turnover margin is the most important stat in college football and Oregon has gotten off to strong start in that department this season with eight takeaways (4 INT, 4 FR) against one giveaway through the first two games. Last year's team finished 109th nationally in turnover margin (-0.77 avg.), giving the ball away 32 times while benefiting from only 22 takeaways. Only seven schools in the country suffered from throwing more than Oregon's 18 interceptions. Unfortunately, the generous mood cost the Ducks on the scoreboard. They generated 46 points (5 TDs, 4 FGs) from the opposition's miscues while yielding 143 points (18 TDs, 6 FGs) from their own turnovers. That amounted to 41 percent of Oregon's total points allowed, or the equivalent of giving away 11 points per game.

**CENTURY MARK PROVES KEY** ... The Ducks are 7-0 since the start of 2006 when they have a 100-yard rusher. JR RB **Jonathan Stewart** has managed the feat six times - most recently at Michigan - while SR QB **Dennis Dixon** accounts for the other. In the

eight other games, UO is 2-6.

**THREE DEEP** ... Not only do the Ducks have two players with third generation names, but they both play right cornerback and rank 1-2 on the depth chart. UO's pair of trips: SO **Walter Thurmond III** and FR **Talmadge Jackson III**.

**PAC MENTALITY** ... Five of the 10 teams in the Pac-10 Conference scored 40 or more points in their season openers led by UO's 48.

**LEADING BY EXAMPLE** ... For the first time in Mike Bellotti's head coaching tenure, the Ducks named season captains at the end of fall camp. JR ROV **Patrick Chung**, SR QB **Dennis Dixon**, SR LB **A.J. Tuitele** and JR C **Max Unger** were selected in a vote by their teammates. Oregon had used game captains since 1993.

**DIXON ON PACE** ... SR QB **Dennis Dixon** has made strides from year to year in his accuracy, completing better than 61.7 percent of his passes (297-481) and putting him on pace to better **Kellen Clemens'** career school record of 61.0 percent.

**RETURNING HONOREES** ... Six Oregon returnees came away from last season receiving honors for their play and are expected to be among the team's leaders for the coming year. Ironically, all are underclassmen. Below is a list of Oregon's 2005 honorees returning.

**COLLEGE GRADUATES** ... Four Oregon seniors take to the football field this fall as college graduates, while one other already has completed his requirements in his major and is expected to graduate by the end of the fall term. **SR QB Brady Leaf** (political science/business minor), **SR LS Eric Steimer** (political science), **SR OG Josh Tschirgi** (political science) and **LB A.J. Tuitele** (political science) already have earned their undergraduate degrees, while **SR QB Dennis Dixon** (sociology) will do so by the end of December.

**ON THE DIAMOND** ... Despite not playing baseball since the summer of 2003, **SR QB Dennis Dixon** was a fifth-round choice of the Atlanta Braves (168th overall) in this summer's Amateur Baseball Draft. Dixon, who turned down an offer to play for the Cincinnati Reds when he was picked in the 20th round in the 2003 draft, returned to Eugene one week prior to the start of fall camp. He began the summer playing for the Gulf Coast Braves in Kissimmee, Fla., before finishing his summer stint with the Danville (VA) Braves. In 28 games, the outfielder accumulated 13 hits in 74 at bats, accounted for eight runs scored and seven RBIs, while stealing five bases without being thrown out. Finishing with a .188 average in Florida, he connected for five hits in his last 12 at bats before spending a final week in Virginia. Although Oregon has not fielded a baseball team since 1981, Dixon isn't the Ducks' first quarterback to pursue a baseball career. **Chris Miller** spent the summer of 1986 playing baseball in the Seattle Mariners' organization before returning to earn first-team all-conference honors on the football field for the second year in a row.

**SECOND TO NONE** ... Individual standouts in the secondary have been one of Oregon's strong suits over the years, with a collection of defensive backs that led the Ducks to the Rose Bowl in 1994 among the best. Four of standouts that played on that team were eventually drafted into the NFL, spanning from senior All-Americans **Chad Cota** and **Herman O'Berry**, and junior **Alex Molden** to freshman **Kenny Wheaton**. Cornerbacks **Rashad Bauman** and **Steve Smith** were multiple year-all conference honorees in the early years of this decade. If last year is an accurate indication, a current contingent of standout defensive backs may rival those groups. **JR ROV Patrick Chung** returns as the leader of the group as has finished among his team's top three tacklers in each of his first two seasons. Seldom has Oregon enjoyed the exploits from a pair of young cornerbacks any more than **Jairus Byrd** and **Walter Thurmond III**, who helped Oregon lead the Pac-10 in pass defense last year as redshirt freshmen. Byrd finished third in the league in interceptions (5) and Chung tied for seventh (4), while Byrd (12) and Chung (10) ranked seventh and eighth, respectively, in passes defended.

**NFL PEDIGREE** ... No fewer than five Oregon players have fathers who played in the National Football League, with the names of their fathers and their NFL career listed in parenthesis. Included are **SO CB Jairus Byrd** (Gill Byrd, DB - San Diego, 1983-92), **FR DT Tonio Celotto** (Mario Celotto, LB - Buffalo, Oakland and Los Angeles Rams, 1977-83), **JR LB Erik Elshire** (Neil Elshire, DE - Minnesota, 1981-86), **SR FS Matthew Harper** (Willie Harper, DE - San Francisco, 1973-83) and **FR LB Casey Matthews** (Clay Matthews, LB - Cleveland and Atlanta, 1978-96).

**STRENGTH OF SCHEDULE** ... Oregon's 12 2007 opponents accumulated an 88-65 record (.575) a year ago, with seven of the foes advancing to bowl games.

**ATTENDANCE RECORD** ... The Ducks played in front of the largest crowd in school history when they traveled to Ann Arbor, Mich., to face the Wolverines on Sept. 8. Michigan Stadium, aka the Big House, which lists a capacity of 107,501, had 109,733 to watch the Big Ten/Pac-10 battle. The largest crowd Oregon had played in front of prior to that was in the 1995 Rose Bowl when 102,247 spectators watched the conference champions face Penn State.

**CONSECUTIVE SELLOUTS** ... Oregon began the 2007 season with its 49th consecutive sellout, extending a streak that dates back to the 1999 season. The last game that fell short of a sellout was vs. Nevada (41,374) on Sept. 18, 1999. USC came to Autzen Stadium the following week, with the Ducks prevailing in a triple-overtime thriller.

**RECORD TICKET SALES** ... Oregon has established a record for season-ticket sales for the 10th year in a row. The Ducks already have sold 43,242 tickets on a season basis, exceeding last year's mark in excess of 42,600 season tickets. A year ago, the school averaged 58,378 fans per game in a stadium that boasts a capacity of 54,000. Single-game tickets still remain for Oregon home games vs. Arizona State.

When Mike Bellotti was elevated to head football coach at the University of Oregon on Feb. 13, 1995, few people could have envisioned the impact the former UC Davis honors student would have on a university, as well as a community, which was coming off its first conference championship in 37 years. In the 12 seasons that followed, all he accomplished would be the navigation of a program through its most successful era in school history.

The Ducks' winningest football coach of all time, Bellotti has guided Oregon to the No. 2 ranking in the country and a Fiesta Bowl win following the 2001 season, led the school to 10 bowl appearances in his 12 years at the helm, tallied eight or more wins in a single season seven times, accumulated the second-most victories (98) of any program in the Pac-10 during his tenure and has overseen a team that has finished among the nation's Top-20 four times in the past eight seasons.

None of his 29 Oregon predecessors can match his timetable for success as well as few in the Pacific-10 Conference. The "Dean of the Pac-10" is tied for eighth all time in conference wins (60-37) while only four former league mentors (John Robinson, Don James, Terry Donahue and Larry Smith) were able to post more conference triumphs than Bellotti in their first 10 years in the Pac-10. His 99-48 ledger as the Ducks' head coach (120-73-2 overall) puts him on the verge of becoming only the sixth coach in conference history to win 100 games at one school, while his winning percentage of 67.3 percent trails only Hugo Bezdek (72.7%—1906, 1913-17) among Oregon's all-time mentors who coached the Ducks a minimum of three seasons.

## 2007 Oregon Football Game Recaps

**Game 1 • Oregon 48, Houston 27  
Sept. 1, 2007**

EUGENE, Ore. (AP) -- Quarterback Dennis Dixon ran for 141 yards, including an 80-yard scoring dash, to lead Oregon a 48-27 victory over Houston on Saturday.

Dixon also completed nine of 15 passes for 134 yards and two touchdowns for the Ducks (1-0) in a wild game that included three touchdowns in less than a minute.

Anthony Alridge had 22 carries for 205 yards and a touchdown for the Cougars (0-1). Alridge also caught three passes for 88 yards and a score.

Dixon's rushing yards were the most for an Oregon quarterback since Tony Graziani ran 108 yards against Oregon State in 1995.

With the score knotted at 20, the Cougars appeared to be on the verge of taking the lead, but Case Keenum's pass into the end zone for Perry McDaniel was intercepted by Oregon's Patrick Chung.

The Ducks, who ended last season with four straight losses, then went ahead when Dixon found Brian Paysinger with a 24-yard pass. Forty seconds later, they added another with Dixon's 6-yard pass to Jaison Williams.

The Cougars answered with Keenum's screen pass to Alridge, who ran 86 yards for the touchdown.

Not to be outdone, Dixon ran a keeper 80 yards for a touchdown on the very next play. That made it 41-27 for Oregon. There were three TDs in the space of 58 seconds, and four in a frame of 1:38.

On Oregon's opening series of the game, Dixon took off with a 50-yard run. Paysinger scored for the Ducks on a 14-yard run to make it 7-0.

Following Alridge's fumble at the Houston 20, Jeremiah Johnson scored on a 3-yard run to make it 14-0 for the Ducks.

Houston, the defending Conference USA champions, started sophomore quarterback Blake Joseph, but he was unable to get anything going. Coach Art Briles did not name a starter in the week prior to the game.

The Cougars turned to Keenum, a redshirt freshman who was able to lead a scoring drive that ended on freshman Terrance Ganaway's first college TD on a 1-yard.

After Matt Evensen's 44-yard field goal made it 17-7 for Oregon, Alridge took off on a 60-yard scoring run for the Cougars, narrowing it to 17-14 midway through the second quarter.

Houston tied it on T.J. Lawrence's 43-yard field goal, but Evensen made a 45-yarder just before halftime to put the Ducks back in front.

Lawrence's 32-yard field goal to start the second half tied it again.

Johnson added another 3-yard scoring run early in the fourth quarter.

Keenum completed 14 of 27 passes for 179 yards and a touchdown. He was intercepted once.

Run defense was a concern after Oregon ranked 78th in the country last year, and the defense appeared to have plenty of trouble with Alridge. His 86-yard TD reception was a career long.

**Game 2 • Oregon 39, Michigan 7  
Sept. 8, 2007**

ANN ARBOR, Mich. (AP) -- Michigan got embarrassed again, just in a different way.

A week after being upset by Appalachian State, the Wolverines were handed their most-lopsided loss in 39 years as Dennis Dixon and the Ducks cruised 39-7 on Saturday. Dixon accounted for 368 yards and a career-high four touchdowns.

Michigan (0-2) has opened a season with two straight losses at home for the first time since 1959 and has dropped four straight, dating to last season, for the first time in four decades.

Unlike the stunning loss to the second-tier Mountaineers, the Wolverines didn't even keep it close against Oregon. The 32-point setback was Michigan's worst since losing 50-14 at Ohio State in 1968, the season before Bo Schembechler's debut in Ann Arbor.

Michigan hasn't won a game since Schembechler died the day before the Ohio State game last year.

The Ducks (2-0) beat Houston handily in its opener, then were even more dominant against a once-proud program that boasts the most wins and best winning percentage in college football.

Dixon led the way with his arm and feet, throwing for 292 yards and tying a career high with three passing TDs - to three receivers - and running for 76 yards and a score. Jonathan Stewart ran for 111 yards and a TD.

Michigan's Chad Henne sailed an ill-advised pass into double coverage that was intercepted with the ease of a punt return and a lower-leg injury knocked him out of the game for the second half.

The Wolverines led 7-3 late in the first quarter on Henne's touchdown pass and stopped the Ducks on a fourth-and-goal at the 1 early in the fourth.

Between those two plays, Oregon seemed to do whatever it wanted against Michigan.

The Ducks led 32-7 at halftime and coasted to the victory against little resistance.

Michigan Stadium's aisles filled with fans that had seen enough after Oregon made it 39-7 in the third quarter and the Big House was so quiet that a small pocket of Oregon supporters could be heard chanting: "Let's Go Ducks! Let's Go Ducks!"

Dixon and the Ducks' spread offense, which is similar to what Appalachian State runs, had its way. Oregon racked up 624 yards, the second-highest total by a Michigan opponent in its 128 years of football.

But what was startling was Michigan's inability to score with an offense widely regarded as one of the nation's best a little more than a week ago.

Henne was just 12-of-23 for 172 yards with a touchdown, which tied John Navarre's school record of 72.

Mike Hart, who was hobbled for the second straight week, had 127 yards rushing for the Wolverines.
